

Fall Update from the Build Site

Here is a brief update on what has been happening on the build site. I actually have several tidbits of good news.

First little bit of good news is that we are making good progress. Even though we are still working with smaller crews, mainly the Codgers, we have all of the framing done, trusses are set and we are starting on the roof sheeting and siding. Exterior doors are in and the windows are on site ready to be installed. In the next couple of weeks, we will continue our efforts to get dried in before the weather turns cold. We're thankful to have the Lewiston Firefighters IAFF Local 1773 out to do the roofing again

We will also pour the concrete for the driveway and that's more good news. The driveway is the last of the concrete work that we have to do. Usually we would have hired a subcontractor to pour our concrete, but this year we did all of the work in-house. We saved several thousand dollars. I can't say enough good about the Codger Crew, concrete is nothing but hard work.

Another bit of great news is that, thanks to grants from Meter Foundation and United Way of Whitman County, we were able to buy a new construction trailer. It's going to work perfectly as a workstation and took storage. The crew is excited just to be able to stand up inside it. We are in the process of getting it organized whenever we have a few extra minutes on the build site .

My last and most important bit of absolutely fantastic news is that even in the middle of a pandemic, and being online only, Beans 'n' Jeans was a huge success. While we didn't quite hit our goal of \$100,000, we raised enough to tackle the next steps, some of the most expensive on a Habitat build, the licensed contractors who do the plumbing, electrical and HVAC installation. That work can't be done by volunteers. I know many of you were a part of Beans 'n' Jeans, so special thank you to all of you - we're still building, thanks to your support. After our subcontractor work is complete, we'll re-assess. There may be a December fund drive to help us finish the home, but we'll cross that bridge when we come to it.

In the meantime, the weather is holding and we're still building. Many thanks for your support!

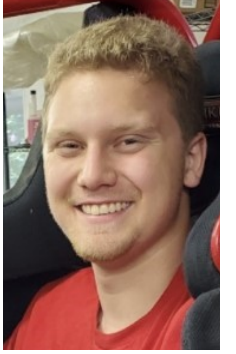

- * Meet other financial criteria.
