These guys and gals have gone above and beyond this year. They have proven that they are definitely the backbone of our organization. I want to give a special shout out to Roger Willemsen who received this year's Habitat Helping Hands award. He truly is a fine craftsman and well deserving of the award.


Here is what happened over the last couple of months. The Lewiston Firefighters from IAFF Local 1773 did our roofing again. There were 8 guys and they completed the roof in just over 3 hours. As good as they are, the same job would have taken the Codgers 3 weeks. We completed the siding and trim and about 99% of the touch up painting. Ken Paulson Plumbing has completed the rough in plumbing and we are just waiting for inspection. Wrightway Mechanical has the HVAC also ready for inspection. Jim Fredenburg started the electrical last week.

One thing that really deserves special attention is the story of our garage door. Girl Scout Troop 3210 of Pullman donated earnings from their cookie sales, just over \$1000 to purchase the garage door for us. I don't know how many boxes of cookies that is, but I do know where I will be buying my Girl Scout cookies next year. Thank you soooo much!

So what's next? We're in a holding pattern for a couple of weeks waiting for electrical and inspections. We have another \$25,000 to raise to finish the home. Drywall, insulation and interior painting are the next big projects. We are also keeping an eye on the pandemic. As we have all year, we will make as much progress on the home as we can while keeping our volunteers and construction crew safe.

Once again thank you to everyone who has volunteered or donated or bought something from the Surplus Sale store. We couldn't do what we do without you. Together we can change peoples' lives. I hope that you all have a Happy Thanksgiving, Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.
