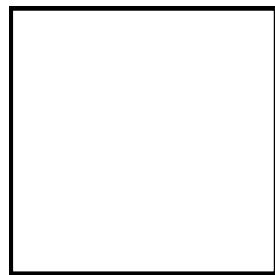

Your Gift: A tool to build homes

Kevin Kirkman made Jake and Shayla's home in Pullman possible with a donation of a buildable lot in 2023. As the walls go up, we asked him to share the story behind the gift. Kevin moved to Pullman in the early 1980s to attend WSU, planning to become an architect. He built a four-plex, living in one unit and renting the others, which sparked a career constructing multi-family, single-family, and later commercial properties. After a long and prosperous career on the Palouse, Kevin wanted to give back to the community and saw Palouse Habitat as the perfect way to make a lasting impact.

As you finalize plans for your 2025 personal giving, consider these options that may have tax benefits for you while helping build and repair more homes around the Palouse:



🏠 Required Minimum Distribution (RMDs): If you're 73 or older, donate directly from your IRA to count toward your RMD and lower taxable income.

🏠 Donor-Advised Fund (DAF) Gifts: Recommend a grant from your DAF. It's easy, flexible, and tax-efficient.

📈 Gifts of Appreciated Stock: Avoid capital gains tax and receive a charitable deduction by donating stocks or mutual funds held for over a year.

🌾 Gifts of Commodities: Farmers can give crops or livestock for tax savings and community impact.

🏠 Non-Cash Assets: Land, vehicles, or other assets can be donated to support our mission.
