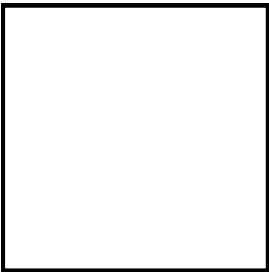

Monthly Giving

Brent and Donna Bradberry have been monthly donors and regular volunteers Palouse HFH since the mid-2000s. "We do this with all the organizations we support," they shared. "It's a timesaver to set up automatic payments, and it's easy to increase over time. But mostly, we love that we're supporting the organizations we care about without having to think about it every month."

Their connection to Habitat began more than 25 years ago, inspired by Jimmy Carter's example and deepened on a service trip to Peru, where they saw entire Habitat-built neighborhoods. Later, after helping a family member with a home purchase, they felt called to do more for local families without the same support. When Brent retired from his second career, they both started volunteering with Palouse Habitat and have supported its growth ever since.



Dave Ostrom has supported Palouse HFH for years on the build site, as a board member, and as a monthly donor. He also regularly gives to the Palouse Land Trust and Rotary Foundation. "These organizations do wonderful work. I've seen first-hand the difference they make in our community and around the world. I see them changing lives in ways that I find meaningful, and I like knowing I'm part of their larger work. I know giving monthly helps these organizations plan and gives them stability to do the work I find so important."
